What are the goals and objectives the client came into the session with, or that you developed with the client in the course of the interview. List succinctly in order of importance.

Polarities: Areas where you sense an inner conflict or split.

**Themes:** Recurring motifs in the client's life.

### **Essences Selected:**

Indicate the method or methods you used to select the essence-Interview- type dream, Kramer, background sheet, Repertory, Pendulum, etc. Provide a list of the essences you selected and why you chose them. Indicate which essence is the primary one for that individual. Justify clearly.
