Remember to review the 90 oils from last term and get to know each new essential oil.


The majority of information on the essential oils can be located inside the online e-course.

1. Name two essential oils in the Rutaceae family where the bark or twigs and leaves are used.

## Fruity Frog, Lip Balm (4A)

2 oz. Cocoa Butter (60 ml = 1/4 cup plus 10 ml)

2 oz. Beeswax- or amount that creates a hardening effect. This can depend on room temperature.

You may test the hardness by dropping melted beeswax on wax paper.

1 oz. Shea butter (30ml)

Essential Oil- 1 ml. (Your choice of citrus oil- lime, lemon, tangerine and orange are often good choices for very kissable lips.)

Melt oils and beeswax on low heat. Remove from heat, add essential oil and mix well Pour into sterile containers.

If neighborhood frogs turn into a prince, (or princess), after application, you know you have become a master level potion maker!

## **Mandarin Tingle Room Spray**



3-8 mls mandarin e.o., (depending on your strength preference)

100 ml spray bottle

Water.

Fill the bottle with water, add the mandarin, shake well and spray to add an uplifting, gentle energy to the room.

### Fruity and Flavorful Tangerine

### Hair Gel

### **Ingredients**:

Distilled Water - 70% Xanthan Gum (as a natural thickener) - 1% Glycerin (humectant) - 5% Aloe Vera Juice (soothing agent) - 10% Tangerine Essential Oil - 2% Lemon Essential Oil - .5% Preservative (e.g., Geogard Ultra) - 1.5%

#### **Phases:**

#### **Phase A** (Water Phase):

Distilled Water
Glycerin
Phase B (Gel Phase):
Xanthan Gum
Phase C (Cool Down Phase):
Aloe Vera Juice
Tangerine Essential Oil
Lemon Essential Oil
Preservative (Geogard Ultra)
Phenoxyethanol
Formulation Technique:



**Prepare Phase A**: Combine distilled water and glycerin in a clean beaker. Heat gently to ensure they blend well.

**Create the Gel:** Slowly sprinkle xanthan gum into the water phase (Phase A) while stirring continuously to prevent clumping. Keep stirring until the gum is fully dispersed and the mixture thickens.

**Incorporate Phase C**: Once the gel base (Phase A + B) has cooled to room temperature, add aloe vera juice, tangerine essential oil, lemon essential oil, preservative, and phenoxyethanol. Stir well after each addition.

**Finalizing:** Ensure the pH is suitable for hair care (typically around 4.5 to 5.5). Adjust if necessary.

Mix thoroughly to ensure a homogeneous product.

**Packaging:** Transfer the gel into a clean, sterilized container.

#### **Special Notes:**

Always conduct a patch test before using the product, especially when incorporating essential oils.

The preservative system is crucial to prevent microbial growth. Ensure it's suitable for your product's pH and water content.

Label your product clearly, including the name, ingredients, and batch number.
